Announcing...Community Blessing Box

Located at the Oak Grove Church of Christ on the corner of Damron Branch and Canoe Run

Dear Oak Grove Church of Christ Members:

You know me as Donovan Damron, one of the preacher's kids. Last summer I had the privilege of serving our county as a Rogers Scholar.

One of the things that Representative Hal Rogers asks of his teenagers, serving as Rogers Scholars, is to complete a project that will help the community in which they live. I approached the Oak Grove Church about placing a small food pantry on the parking lot at the Church. They have given their approval for a "Community Blessing Box." The box has been built and is being used by the community. You can see it in the grassy area by the lower parking lot.

The Blessing Box is a "give what you can and take what you need" miniature food pantry that operates on the honor system. If someone is in need of food, then they are welcomed to take from the food box. If you have been blessed to be able to give, then you can stock non-perishable food items or essential hygiene (soap, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.) items in the box whenever you please. It is as simple as that!

The goal is to provide essential needs for people that may not be able to purchase these items on their own. Any help you can give to the community blessing box will be greatly appreciated as we would like to keep the blessing box stocked for those in need.

Once again, I want to make my church family aware of this service and also soliciting your help to make this project work as a "give what you can and take what you need" food pantry. If you can give, please do. If this will help your family in any way or at any time, then please feel free to take what you need!
